2. Personal data

Personal data comprises information by which a natural person (the data subject) can be identified or is identifiable. Personal data that BloomTax processes may include:

- > Basic information such as your first and last name, prefix and title;
- Contact details such as your e-mail address, postal address and phone number;
- > Financial information, such as your bank account number;
- > Technical details, such as your IP address and the device you use to visit our website;
- Personal data you may provide us for the purpose of a job application, such as your full name, date of birth, address, phone number, nationality, marital status and any other personal data set out in your application;

- Due to a justifiable interest.

5. Retention period

BloomTax will not store your personal data any longer than is necessary to achieve the purposes stated in this Privacy Policy or to comply with the relevant laws and regulations.

6. Sharing personal data

In some cases BloomTax may also share your personal data with third parties. This may include, but is not limited to:

- Third parties relevant to the legal services that we provide, such as counterparties, third parties in connection with a case that we are handling, courts, regulatory authorities and governmental institutions;
- Third parties that we engage with, such as supervisory authorities and other bodies, in order to comply with legal obligations;
- > Third party suppliers in connection with the processing of your personal data for the purposes described in this Privacy Policy, such as IT providers, communication service providers or other suppliers to whom we outsource certain support services.

We will only transfer your personal data to the above mentioned third parties for the purposes and on the legal grounds stated in this Privacy Policy.

Third parties to whom we transfer your personal data are themselves responsible for compliance with privacy legislation. BloomTax is neither responsible nor liable for the processing of your personal data by these third parties. To the extent that a third party processes your personal data as a data processor of BloomTax, BloomTax will conclude a processor agreement with such party that meets the requirements set out in the GDPR.

To be able to provide our services, it may be necessary for us to transfer your personal data to a recipient in a country outside of the European Economic Area. In that case, BloomTax will ensure that the data transfer is compliant with the applicable law.

7. Security
